Literacy	During this term we will be looking at the structure, language and presentation of narrative poems and writing our own using this knowledge.  We will be reading the famous novel 'Journey to the centre of the Earth' and completing some work on this which is also linked to our geography topic. Finally we will be finishing off the term with some non-fiction writing based on volcanoes.
Mathematics 4	This term we will be doing some further work on Addition and subtraction. We will also be looking at fractions and how this links to our everyday lives. Please join us on the 26th January for our maths workshop. (See separate letter for details)
Science	Rocks and soils will be scattered across the class- room this term whilst we investigate, test, com- pare and classify. Children will learn about the different types of rocks and how and why they are formed. Children will be making their very own fossils!
<u>ICT</u>	This term we will be looking at creating more complex sequences in coding. We will be learning that time can be used in programming to control physical systems such as traffic lights.
RE	Our learning challenge this term is 'Why do people follow Jesus?' We will be learning about religious vocabulary, events in the life of a modern day Christian and our heroes and role models.  Celebrating your creative expressions of faith
French	In French we will be learning the names of some cotours, numbers to twenty and the names of some popular playground games. We will learn how to say which game we prefer and after conducting a survey, we will create a pictogram of the results.
