
A school where everyone shines.

Welcome back after half term!
We hope you have all had a good rest and are ready to learn.
Here is what we will be learning:



Subject	Learning Challenge—The USA What's so special about the USA?
History Geography	<i>As historians</i> we will be continuing to learn about the history of the USA. We will learn about early civilisation and looking at key explorers such as Christopher Columbus. We will be looking at other important figures such as presidents and inventors. <i>As Geographers</i> we will be continuing to compare the USA to other countries that we know, and looking at both physical and human features of the area. We will be studying the importance of the Mississippi River on the surrounding area.
Art and Design	<i>As artists</i> we will be studying floral artwork by artists such as Vincent van Gogh. We will also be looking at using textiles to create our own pieces of floral artwork. We will be continuing to use different materials such as textured papers and sketching pencils.
P.E. 	P.E. sessions will still be on Tuesday and Wednesday (Peacock Class) and Tuesday and Thursday (Heron Class). You will need your kit in school. If you have long hair you will need a bobble to tie it back, if you wear earrings you will need to take them out. As we move into the warmer months, we will be doing PE outside if it's dry and you are welcome to bring jogging bottoms, sweatshirt and trainers to help keep you warm. If, for any reason, you are poorly or unable to do PE you will need a note from home before you are excused.
PSHE 	During this half term our sessions will be based around 'Good to be me'. The theme is about understanding our feelings as well as considering our strengths and weaknesses as learners. It aims to develop knowledge, understanding and skills in three key social and emotional aspects of learning: self-awareness, managing feelings and empathy.

 <p>Literacy</p>	<p>We will be developing our reading and writing skills throughout the half term by looking at different genres. We will be using 'The Secret Garden' as our class text, and will use the skills that we have learnt to write our own descriptive story. We will conclude the term by studying different types of poetry.</p> 
 <p>Mathematics</p>	<p>Please refer to our website for details of National Curriculum 2014 to see the national expectations for children in Year Five.</p> 
 <p>Science</p>	<p><u>As scientists</u> we will be studying plants (life processes and living things). We will develop our scientific enquiry skills by asking ourselves questions about plants and undertaking research to find the answers. We will be looking at how plants reproduce through seed dispersal, the plant life cycle and also labelling different parts of a plant. We will be growing our own plants alongside our work throughout the term.</p>
 <p>ICT</p>	<p><u>As information communication technologists</u> we will be learning how to be effective researchers, and using the internet safely to find information that we need. We will be using our research in Computing to support our Geography unit.</p>
<p>RE</p>	<p><u>As theologians</u> we will be investigating the question: 'What can be learnt from the Jewish way of life?' We will be studying and comparing Christianity and Judaism. We will also be looking at the Easter story, and its importance to the Christian faith.</p>
 <p>French</p>	<p>In French this half term, we will be continuing to learn to ask for and give simple directions to places around town.</p>
