

Homework

Please see the school website to read the Homework Policy. As a school we want to improve children's basic skills. To support your child in improving their basic skills they will need to read on a regular basis, practise spellings given and practise the common exception words (found in the middle of their reading record) and finally practise their times tables.

Your child will continue to use the booklet called 'Multiplication tables' (screenshot below). Your child will need to work through the bronze, silver and gold challenges depending on which times table they are working on. The times tables should be worked in the following order: 1, 2, 10, 5, 3, 4, 8, 6, 7, 9, 11, 12. This booklet should be brought back to school everyday where the children will be assessed and a decision made on whether they have achieved the challenge.

Multiplication Tables Awards	
BRONZE	For being able to say a complete multiplication table e.g. "One times two is two..."
SILVER	For being able to give the product of numbers multiplied together e.g. Q: "What is four times?"
GOLD	For giving facts when presented with the product only. e.g. 1/15 six = seven eight/ eight sevens

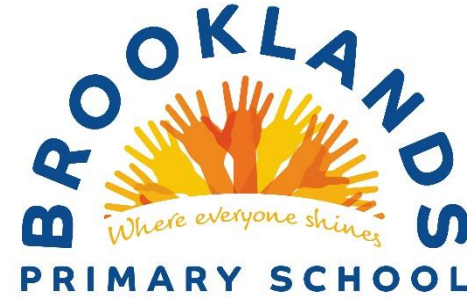

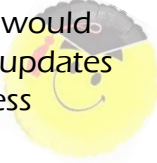

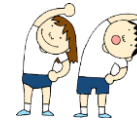
